- A high level of participation in level 2 competition including SEN specific competition and increased participation in KS1 competition is something that we strive to achieve. This was not possible for the second half of last year and continues to be this year.
- Plans in place to extend permanent playtime equipment for KS1 to enable sustainable activity at break and lunchtimes and to add interest.
- Development of woodland area as an OAA / team building resource and activity area for less sporty children to engage with. This area proved vital in mental health/ well-being of Key worker children / Yr 6 children during the summer 1 term.

Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:

- Continue staff development; initially helping some staff to get the children back into school and enjoying PE, team-building activities to support a particular year group with some PSHE problems that were exacerbated by lockdown and on new sports added to curriculum last year but not yet tried out due to school closures.
- Continue attending competitions by participating in virtual level 2 competitions organised by HSSP
- More permanent equipment required for playtime- esp where can be accessed by KS1. Develop the 'cage' area to be better used for both active playtimes and PE lessons. Preferably dual-purpose; that can be used for active breaks and in PE lessons.

Due to covid restrictions the majority of the money this year is to be spent on developing some of the outdoor areas, purchasing long term equipment that can be used to both increase activity in playtimes and be used in PE lessons / active breaks.
